

Sport Premium Report

From September 2013, all schools have been provided with funding to support the Olympic legacy and to enable the delivery of effective sports provision. Within the Diocese of Salisbury Academy Trust we aim to provide high quality sport. At Shrewton CE Primary School Academy, over a number of years we have provided the following:

- **Opportunities for children to participate in a variety of sports and competitions.**
- **Access to high quality coaching in a variety of sports from specialist sports coaches.**
- **Continuing professional development for teachers to enable even better teaching of PE and sports.**
- **A school-wide passion for well-being linked to positive mental health through sport and fitness including 'Healthy Body, Healthy Mind' well-being afternoon.**
- **Investment in sports equipment and facilities to ensure children are active during the school day outside of PE sessions.**

Impact Report 2024/2025

Our Sport Premium Funding for the last academic year was £16,760 This money was used as follows and impacted as detailed below:

Activity	Budget	Impact Assessment
Ben Coombes Sports Coaching and provision of additional after school club	£6000	Staff are being upskilled to support the provision of physical education. Children are being taught by a specialist building on a progression of skills that are appropriate to their age and stage of learning. Pupils get a broad coverage of sports activities and opportunity to compete competitively using the skills they have learnt.
Swimming Provision	£2500	All KS2 pupils have had access to at least 1 session of high-quality swimming per week for two terms. All KS2 pupils including SENS were 'water confident' by the end of the summer term. All KS2 children were water safe by end of academic year.
After School Club Provision	£375	Increased number of pupils attended club – disadvantaged EMS pupils targeted to invest in overall wellbeing and health.
Residential trips	£1000	Enabled all Y6 pupils to attend residential experience and wide range of high-risk level activities.
Equipment and resources	£1000	Children had the resources to be active during break and lunch time. The equipment they had was appropriate to their physically development and safe to use independently and we saw a marked improvement in Pupil behaviour during play times. PE equipment purchased for pupils to rehearse skills with school staff outside of PE provision.
Forest School Lead HLTA	4000	Forest School provision is now completely established for the whole school. This has supported the bonding of mixed aged classes and pupils' physical regulation. Pupils are more settled in class with this more frequent experience. Investment in additional resources has enabled whole class participation and CPL has enabled both teachers to lead learning outside the classroom.

Action Plan for Current Year 2025/2026

Our Sport Premium Funding for the current academic year is: £16, 950. The following plan details how we plan to use the money to maintain and improve provision.

Activity	Budget	Anticipated Impact
Ben Coombes Sports Coaching and provision of additional after school club	£6000	Children will continue to develop the P.E skills gained from previous years and will have access to a range of sporting opportunities taught by qualified sports coaches. Staff will gain valuable CPD and will receive of lesson plans, which include progression of skills.
Swimming Provision	£4000	Children will develop their swimming skills and water safety awareness. This will provide vital opportunities to children who otherwise would not have an opportunity to learn this life skill. All KS2 to swim giving every child the opportunity of being able to swim 25m by the end of KS2. Swimming will be introduced in EYFS ensuring water safely and confidence is part of our school and community links as we have a river running through the village.
After School Club Provision	£375	Further opportunities to experience a wider range of activities, including dance, football, tag rugby, netball, hockey etc.
Residential trips	£1000	To enable all Y6 pupils to attend residential experience and wide range of high-risk level activities. Cost goes towards transport to all and additional support for disadvantaged pupils.
PE tops for all children and School logo polo shirts for all staff	£120	A PE uniform has been inclusive for all pupils. House colours have created a greater sense of community with a regular kit for in house events. Pupils are safely dressed to participate and look smart.
PE and playground equipment and resources	£1000	PE and sport provision will be resourced with high quality and appropriate equipment and materials. Children will have a rich, engaging P.E curriculum linked to National Curriculum objectives.
Equipment and resources for a Forest school area within the school grounds.	£1000	To ensure a Forest School programme can run effectively and efficiently an area needs to be set up and resources within the school grounds.
Forest School L3 Qualification	£1200	A Forest School L3 member of staff within school would enable Shrewton Primary school to set up, plan and deliver a Forest School program to all children across the school.
HILTA FS hours	4000	To lead FS sessions across the school developing Teachers understanding of FS principles etc (CPD). Support teachers as they lead FS and outdoor learning sessions allowing each class to move to a weekly FS or ODL session rather than fortnightly.
Total Budget	£17,495	



- This report will be updated at the end of the academic year to identify the success of the above initiatives and the impact that they have had.
- Delivery will be monitored by the PE Leader in the first instance. This will be overseen and managed at a senior level by the Head of School.
- We will monitor the take-up of activities, including by children entitled to Pupil Premium funding.
- Monitoring will include observations of teaching, drop-ins to clubs run by outside agencies to ensure that provision is of high quality. We will review progress against this plan and identify next steps, on a termly basis.
